“After the Mayflower” begins in New England in the 1620s, at the time of the so called ‘first Thanksgiving’. In March of 1621, Massasoit chief of the Wampanoag, negotiated a diplomatic alliance with a band of English settlers for the benefit of his people. It was a gamble that paid off for several decades, as Indians and colonists coexisted in relative peace. A half century later, as a brutal war flared between the English colonists and a confederation of New England Indians, the wisdom of Massasoit’s choice seemed less clear.
