This gripping story takes place in 1973 at the siege of Wounded Knee, examining the broad political and economic forces that led to the emergence of the American Indian Movement (AIM) in the 1960s. For 71 days, activists engaged in a standoff with the U.S. government, bringing the nation's attention to desperate conditions on the Indian reservations. Perhaps even more important, the siege united Indian people across the tribes creating a pan-Indian identity and a new path into the future.
