To bridge the growing gap between the young and the old, she lets Naalak, an elder, and Danny, a young policeman from Kangirsujuaq, tells us what they think. ... Can Inuit culture survive in the modern world?

Keep the Circle Strong - This film follows Mike Auger, a Cree Indian from northern Alberta, who embarks on a five-month journey to Bolivia to live and work with the Aymara Indians, Bolivia's largest indigenous group. Through his journey, we witness the story of one man's quest to recover his Native culture as well as discover the striking parallels between two Native peoples.
